

# Creating an account on Odysee



To get started, go to the Odysee platform. Click on the **“Sign Up”** button located at the top right of the screen. You can quickly create an account using an email address, or by signing in with an existing account (such as Google). Then follow the on-screen instructions to confirm your registration and access your personal dashboard.

## Channel customization

Once your account has been created on Odysee, go to the menu located on the right, **“My channel page”** > **(Ma page de chaîne)**, to set up your channel. Start by filling in the main information: **channel title, description, and keywords** (example: “Digital tutorials”, description: “Simple videos to learn how to use online tools”, keywords: tutorial, digital, beginner).

Then add a **banner** (recommended size: **2560 × 1000 px**) as well as a profile image (**avatar**, ideally **200 × 200 px**). To find free and high-quality visuals, you can use reliable websites such as Pixabay, Unsplash, or Pexels.

To zoom in, you can use the keyboard by holding the **CTRL** key and pressing **+** to zoom in or **-** to zoom out, or you can use **CTRL** + the mouse wheel by **scrolling forward or backward**. On some websites, due to protection scripts or technical limitations, mouse zoom may not work; in such cases, you should use the keyboard instead.

## Preparing video files and images

When uploading a video on Odysee , it is recommended to adopt a simple approach from the very beginning in order to avoid errors and save time .


The most important point concerns the video file name. It should be clear and standardized: in lowercase, without accents, and without spaces. Instead of spaces, it is recommended to use either hyphens (-) or underscores (\_). For example, a bad file name would be: ❌ “Message of Jesus To Sister Laurence FINALéééé.mp4”. A correct file name with hyphens would be: “message-jesus-soeur-laurence.mp4”, and with underscores: ✔ “message\_jesus\_soeur\_laurence.mp4”.

Both solutions are technically valid , but hyphens (-) are often preferred because they are more readable and better interpreted in web environments, while underscores (\_) are also very stable and widely used. In any case, it is strongly recommended not to use spaces, as they can be converted into special characters (%20) and cause errors or complications during import .

Then, during the upload, it is better not to try to optimize everything immediately. It is best to keep things simple: a short title that can be edited later , a brief description, and possibly only one or two keywords for the upload. The goal is to keep the process light and smooth  in order to avoid technical errors during submission.

Once the video is published ✔, it is then possible to go back and improve the title, complete the description, and add more keywords in order to optimize visibility.

 **When a video fails to upload, it is recommended to review all the points mentioned above.**

To **add video content**, click on this icon. 



The list of your uploaded videos is accessible from the **menu on the right** :

 **Téléchargements**

You enter a **title**, a **URL**, and the **video description as text**. You can archive these elements in folders on your computer to keep them in case of a problem or accidental deletion. This way, you will not have to redo all the writing work.

You also have the option to create live videos.



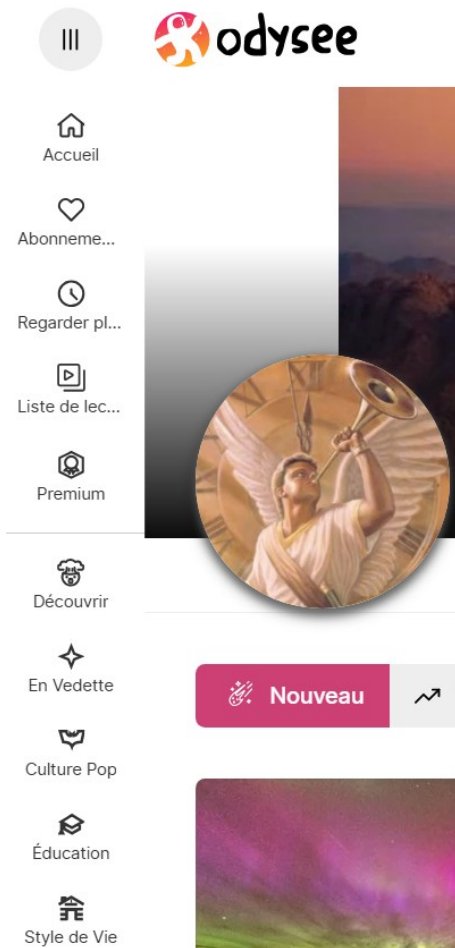
And it is generally always the same procedure: you fill in the fields, select your video, and then you can upload it to your channel. It will then be visible in your channel section via the **“Content”** link.

To **add a text article**, click on this icon.  

You enter a **title**, a **URL**, and **the text content**. Please keep a copy of your text in a program on your computer so that you can reuse it or paste it into the Odysee editor if necessary.

Then, at the bottom of the page, click on **“Next”** until your content is published.

In your channel menu, the **“Content”** link displays both text and video content. All published items then appear in this section. By clicking on them, you can access either your video or your text page with comments, if comments have been enabled.



## Playlists (Listes de lectures)

In the **left-hand menu** of Odysee, click on the **“Playlists (Listes de lectures)”** link. Then select **“Add a playlist (Ajouter une liste de lecture)”**.

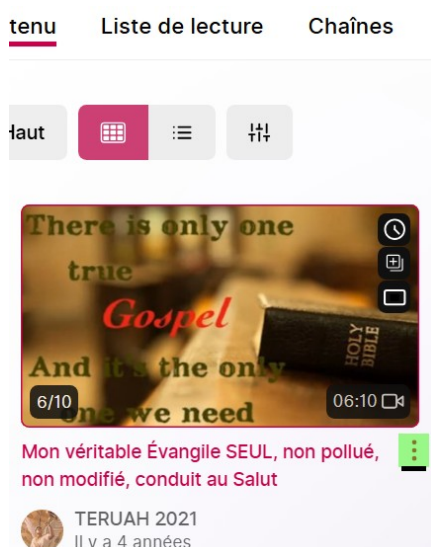


You will then access a form to complete: fill in the required fields (title, description, etc.), then add an image to illustrate your playlist. It is possible to repeat the process to adjust or replace the image if necessary before confirming.

Once the information has been completed, click on **“Save (Enregistrer)”** or **“Save (Sauvegarder)”** to finalize the creation of the playlist.

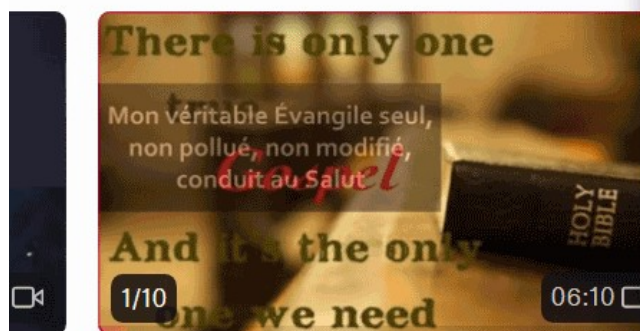
It is recommended to create your playlists in an organized and progressive way, as the interface generally displays the most recently created playlist first in the menu when selecting videos on other channels.

## Adding content to a playlist (Ajout de contenus dans une liste de lecture)



You can then enrich your playlist by adding content from other channels. To do this, browse Odysee looking for videos. Go to the desired channel, either via the **“Home (Accueil)”** page (if the **“New content (Nouveau contenu)”** module is displayed), or via the **“Content (Contenu)”** tab.

Below the video, next to the title, click on the **three dots (options menu)**. In this menu, you can usually select the **“Add to playlist (Ajouter à la liste de lecture)”** option, then choose the relevant playlist; sometimes the most recently created playlist appears directly in the context menu.

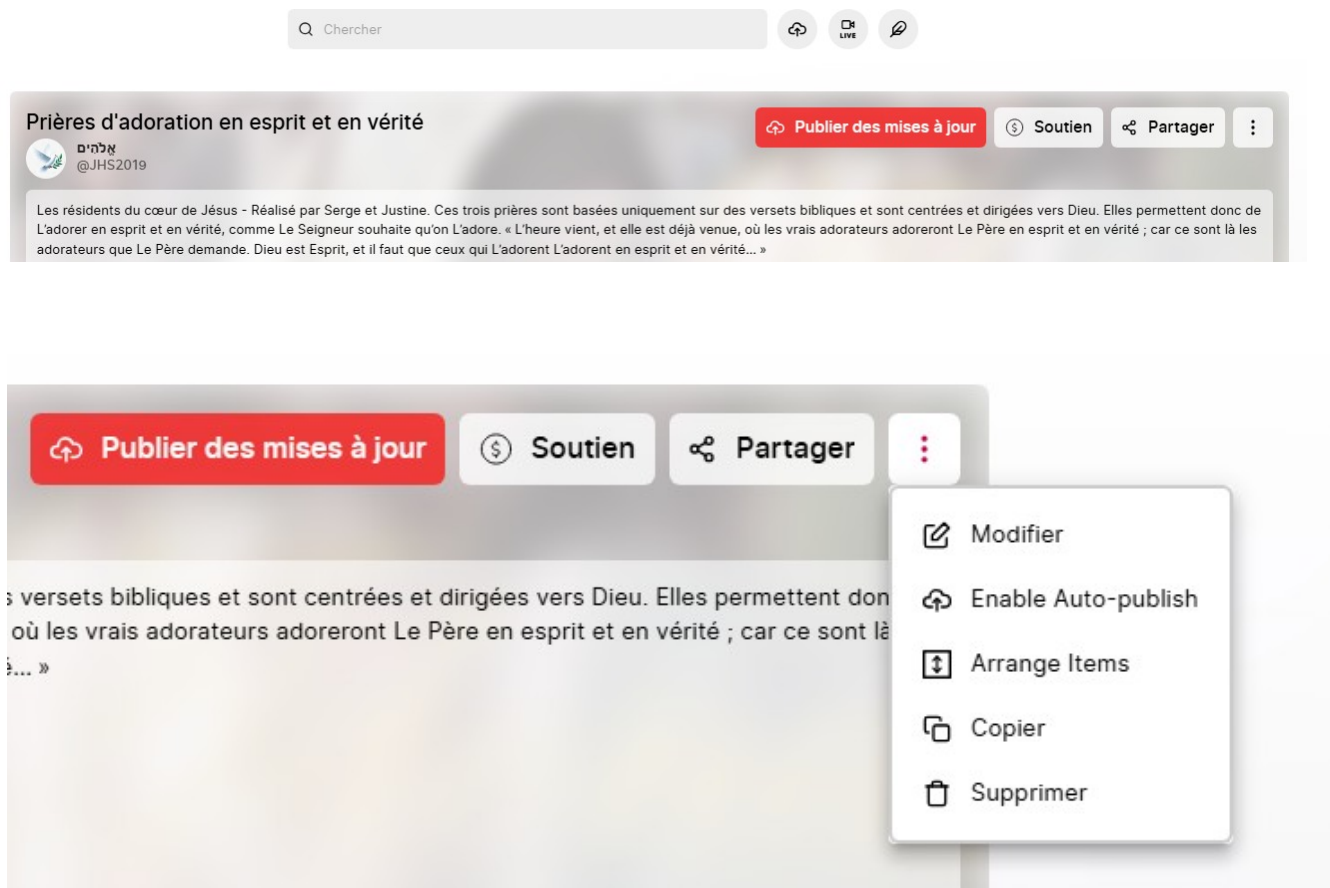
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## Playlist management and organization (Gestion et organisation des listes de lecture)

To find or manage an existing playlist, go back to the **“Playlists (Listes de lectures)”** menu. There you will find all the playlists you have created. If a playlist does not appear immediately, it is usually enough to select it from the full list of your creations.

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## Editing your videos or playlists (Modification de vos vidéos ou de vos listes de lectures)



You can, and it is strongly recommended when **uploading your videos on Odysee**, to enable the “**Auto publish (Publication automatique)**” option, available in both your video settings and your playlists.

This option can be found in the menu represented by the three dots (⋮), located on the content editing page, whether for a video or a playlist.

“**Auto publish (Publication automatique)**” allows certain updates to your content to be published automatically without having to manually perform the “publish update (publier une mise à jour)” action.

Concretely, when you modify the title, description, thumbnail, or keywords of a video or a playlist, these changes may require validation in order to become visible online.

With “**Auto publish (Publication automatique)**” **enabled**, this validation is performed automatically, which avoids having to manually republish after each modification.

Once your setup is complete and your content is stable, you can switch this option back to manual mode if you wish to maintain control over updates.

## **Important limitations** (Limitations importantes)

It is important to note that playlists on Odysee only apply to content hosted within the platform. You cannot directly add videos or playlists from YouTube to them. Similarly, **iframe** embed code is not supported in articles or playlists.

If you want to share a YouTube playlist, the solution is to insert a link in an article so that users can open it in a new tab.

## **YouTube content synchronization and import**

Odysee also offers a separate feature that allows you to import or synchronize content from a YouTube channel to your Odysee channel.

This option is different from **playlists** as well as from manually adding videos to your channel. It allows you to **automatically copy your YouTube videos** so that they are published on Odysee, depending on the synchronization settings you choose.

It is important not to confuse these features:

- **Playlists** are used only to organize and group content that is already available on Odysee.
- **Manually adding videos** consists of publishing a file or video directly to your channel.
- **YouTube synchronization** is a separate feature that automatically duplicates your content from YouTube to Odysee.

Depending on the configuration, this synchronization can be automatic or occasional, but it remains independent from playlist management and from the platform's internal content organization.

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# Importing or synchronizing a YouTube channel to Odysee

Odysee offers a feature that allows you to automatically import or synchronize the content of a YouTube channel to your Odysee account.

## 1. Accessing the synchronization feature

To get started, log in to your Odysee account, then go to your channel settings (“Settings” or “Channel settings”, depending on the language).

Look for the option related to **YouTube synchronization** or **YouTube channel import**.

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## 2. Connecting your YouTube channel

Two methods may be available depending on the case:

- **Direct connection via Google/YouTube account**  
You authorize Odysee to access your YouTube channel through a secure login.
  - **Using an authorization key or code**  
In some cases, Odysee may request an access code or validation key in order to link your YouTube channel to your Odysee account.
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## 3. Choosing synchronization settings

Once the connection is established, you can choose the settings:

- automatic import of new videos
  - manual or one-time import
  - full synchronization of the existing channel
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## 4. Role of administrators

If your YouTube channel is managed by multiple people, a primary administrator may be required to authorize the connection and validate the synchronization. This depends on the channel’s management settings and the associated Google permissions.

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## 5. Important points

- Synchronization creates a copy of YouTube videos on Odysee
- Once imported, videos remain independent
- Settings may vary depending on platform updates
- This feature is separate from playlists and manual uploads

# Home Page Management 🏠 ✨

The Odyssey home page is your main interface for **discovering, organizing, and showcasing content**. It is composed of several **sections or modules** that you can **customize and rearrange** according to your needs.

## Types of modules ♦

- **Recommended:** suggested videos based on your subscriptions and viewing activity.
- **Following:** latest content from the channels you follow.
- **Trending:** popular videos on the platform.
- **Latest:** all recently uploaded videos.
- **Thematic sections:** custom feeds grouping videos by channels, categories, or topics.

## How to manage your home page 🛠️

### 1. Add a section

- Go to your **Home page**.
- Click on **“Add Section”**.
- Choose the content type: specific channel, category, or custom feed.
- Click **“Save”** to confirm. ✅

### 2. Edit an existing section

- On each module, click the **three dots** ⋮ in the top right corner.
- Select **“Edit Section”**.
- You can change the title, content source, or display order.
- Click **“Save”** to apply changes.

### 3. Remove a module

- Click the **three dots** ⋮ on the module.
- Select **“Remove Section”**.
- Confirm deletion. ⚠️

### 4. Reorder sections

- Hover over a module until you see the **drag & drop icon** (≡).
- Click and hold, then **move the module** to the desired position.
- Release to confirm the new order.

## 💡 Methodological tip:

- Start with the **essential sections:** Following and Latest for subscriptions and recent updates.
- Add Recommended or Trending to increase content discovery.
- Use thematic sections to **highlight playlists or specific content categories**.
- Test different layouts to optimize user experience and navigation. 🚀
